Cyclone season has officially started so if you haven't already made your annual preparations then don't put it off any longer. This year residents are being encouraged to PLAN, PACK, LISTEN to ensure they are fully prepared.

PLAN



Make a household emergency plan. In addition to cleaning up around your property, ensure you have arrangements in place for yourself and family if a cyclone was to threaten. Identify the strongest rooms in your home, have emergency numbers and kit handy, and make sure you know what to do when a Cyclone Watch is declared.

PACK



Pack an emergency kit. Gather essential emergency items from around your home and place them together in a sturdy waterproof container. Ensure you have your battery operated radio, enough water for up to three days and a supply of non-perishable food.

LISTEN



Stay informed. Listen to your radio for up-to-date reports and warnings from the Bureau of Meteorology and Emergency Services. At all times, follow their advice and stay safe this cyclone season.

How Babinda Got Its Name

Portion 460 after the forfeiture by Pettett, was subdivided into smaller areas, and were re-numbered, and taken up as follows:-

Portion 32V E Gambazzi, followed by Rose Angelica (Pollard) Gambazzi

Portion 33V Michael Spillane 22/11/1889 to 30/12/1891, followed by James Pollard 13/9/1893

Portion 34V William John Munro, Died 7/11/1913. Followed by Janet Taylor Munro, followed by G Visini & E Franzi

Portion 35V Richard Andrew De Molyens selected 15/3/1894, followed by Charles Adrian Butter selected 18/12/1902, Catatrina Margarita Moller 19/9/1907.

Portion 37V Fred Cope selected 20/7/1894

Portion 49V James C Lloyd

The re-subdivision of the southern part of Portion 460 did not follow the original survey lines.

Joseph G Eastwood tried to track down how Babinda Creek got its name, by contacting JJ O'Leary (an officer of the Cairns Shire Council from 1880 to 1933 who then referred him to Hector Munro the surveyor. Munro advised him that it was Babinda Creek when he arrived there in 1883. No mention is made of it in 'Trinity Phoenix' by Dorothy Jones, or in any of JW Collinson's Books on the early days of Cairns. However, Collinson became aware of how the creek was named, but too late to be included in any of his books. In his "Cuttings Book" held in the State Archives, is a small Newspaper, or Magazine cutting which reads as follows:-

'VKE: Babinda (Q) was so named from the creek on which it stands, which was named in 1881 by WH Pottett, who owned land in the vicinity, after a station he took up near Numagee (NSW) in the 1870's.

The misspelling of Pettett may have misled anyone trying to follow this lead. Also the year 1881 was wrong a Pettett didn't come into the area until late 1883. On the Back of this cutting, written in pencil, was the date August 1951.

My sincere thanks go to Robert Hinxman, for the time, effort and cost he put into researching the Queensland State Library and Archives, for information contained in this article. Robert is a former Treasurer and President of the Mulgrave Shire Historical Society.

So what is the meaning of Babinda?

I contacted AIATSIS in Canberra who forwarded my information on the tribes and languages surrounding Nyngan and Babinda Station. These were:-

Wiradjuri – no listing of Babinda

Wailwan – no listing of Babinda

Wongaibon – no listing of Babinda

Publications consulted were:-

"Place names in Queensland, New Zealand and the Pacific"

"Australian Aboriginal Words: Aboriginal English, English Aboriginal"

"Macquarie Aboriginal Words; A Dictionary of Words from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Languages."

No listing of Babinda in any of the above publications.

"Place names of Australia" lists Babinda as derived from an aboriginal word 'bunda' meaning mountain.

"The Cambridge Dictionary of Australian Places" lists Babinda as derived from 'binda' a Yindny aboriginal word, meaning waterfall.

Two publications on Yidiny both by RMW Dixon do not list Babinda, but do list 'binda' as meaning waterfall, shoulder, top of tree and top of waterfall.

Richard & Barbara Appleton in their publications point out that many aboriginal names have corrupted by misunderstanding of the early settlers interpretations of the spoken word, and in some cases, by aboriginal sense of humour, and only about 25 per cent are likely to be correct.

It is clear that Babinda is not from Yidin language as Babinda sheep station in New South Wales was named many years before the white man settled in the Cairns-Innisfail area.

So what exactly does the word 'babinda' mean? Professor RWM Dixon in a letter to me in 1978 said that he believed its true meaning has been lost with time.

The word Babinda comes from the aboriginal Kamillori tribe whose tribal lands were the Babinda Sheep station, just north of Nymagee NSW.

Curtis Pitt MP Member for Mulgrave Recruiting for Doctors underway

Interviews for the three doctor positions at Babinda were held on Tuesday 1 December and the recruitment process is being finalised. Babinda community member, Mr Fred Lizzio was the community representative on the recruitment panel. There was a large applicant pool and Queensland Health is hopeful the successful applicants will start early in the New Year.

Queensland Health will continue to provide locum medical staff for the hospital as well as the private general practice, as arranged in late October for a 3-month period.

It is expected Dr Andrew Clift, Dr Mohammed Sadique and Dr Simon Ling will continue to provide medical services to Babinda until the new permanent staff commence. Medical cover will continue for Babinda over Christmas and New Year.

Bus Service

I was recently contacted by a group of Babinda seniors who outlined the problems they were experiencing with the current location of the bus stop on Howard Kennedy Drive.

For many seniors the only mode of transport to Cairns and Innisfail is by bus. The relocation of the Greyhound bus stop two years ago had the unintended consequence of also relocating the Sun Palm bus service which is used by many of our seniors.

The relocated bus stop means the elderly passengers, many of which rely on mobility aids, have to walk out of town and cross the busy Bruce Highway to catch the bus. Clearly this is not acceptable, especially as Babinda experiences high temperatures and the state's highest rainfall.

I have written to Mayor Val Schier asking for Council to designate a bus stop for the Sun Palm service at Anzac Park which will also provide shelter, lighting and toilet facilities. The Mayor has confirmed the Council is investigating this, as well as the potential to subsidise services.

On behalf of my wife Kerry, son Tristan, electorate staff Andrew and Kobi, I wish you a safe and happy festive season. My office will be closed over the Christmas/New Year break, reopening Monday 11 January.







This is the story of John Miller and the PEACE BURSARY


John Miller was born in Babinda in 1922 and was one of eight kids, 5 boys and 3 girls. John went to school in Babinda, and afterwards got a job as a "Billy Boy". The Second World War started in 1939 and although only 17 years old, John yearned to enlist. His mother was not keen, but gave her consent. His father was working away in Mt Molloy and was needed to sign John's papers. Not to be beaten, John Miller peddled his bike the 134 miles to Mt Molloy and back, and succeeded in enlisting in the Australian Army. John's battalion was posted to Singapore, only to be captured by the Japanese Army at the "Fall of Singapore".

For the next 4 years John Miller was a Prisoner of War of the Japanese Imperial Forces, along with thousands of other Aussie prisoners, who worked on the infamous Burma Railway in inhuman conditions. John Miller managed to survive. As a consequence of this terrible part of his life, he hated the Japanese and anything Japanese, with awful intensity, for many years. Until by chance he became friendly with a Japanese Professor, who has become John Miller's good friend.

John Miller is now 87 years old and has returned to Babinda School, which he attended 80 years ago, to say to our young boys and girls "What has war ever achieved? Do not waste your time hating your fellow man."

He has presented his PEACE BURSARY to two young students of Grades 8 and 9, Mark Nucifora and Conor Johnson, students at John's old school, to encourage the young to embrace PEACE and NOT WAR. Both these boys are deserving of this Bursary.
