Police News

The past month has been quite a busy one for us here at the Station. Probably most concerning of all is the fact that we have

uncharacteristically had two break and enters reported along with an attempted break and enter. On the 03/10/2009 in the early hours persons have attempted to enter the rear of the Bakery by jemmying the roller door, however entry was not gained. At this stage police have identified a number of persons of interest in relation to this and the matter has been forwarded to Innisfail CIB for their attention. Secondly a farm shed at Bellenden Kerr was entered sometime over the past three weeks with power tools and a parts wash basin stolen. On this occasion the owner was away at the time and investigations are continuing. Lastly sometime over the weekend of the 30/10/2009 unknown persons have forced entry to the aquatic centre before taking a small amount of cash and causing an amount of damage to the office area. This matter is also still being investigated.

Please if anyone has any information in relation to these matters can they contact the station. Information can be provided anonymously and of course any information can be provided in full confidence. Furthermore these incidents provide a timely reminder to everyone to be extra vigilant with their property security. I also ask that we all keep our eye out for suspicious activity within our community and report it to police so that we can keep Babinda such a great place to live.

On one last note you may have noticed police from Babinda and Innisfail Traffic regularly conducting radar in the 60 zone on the Bruce Highway through town lately. Unfortunately we are regularly detecting some very high speeds in this zone (over the 100kph mark) and motorists don't seem to be heeding the speed limit. With these idiots on the road, please be vigilant when using the intersection and ensure that you leave yourself plenty of time to pull out into the traffic. Remember not everyone values their safety on the road like you do.

Cairns Regional Council Notes By Paul Gregory

"Hi from CRC.

An issue of real concern recently has been the direction from the State Government regarding the abolition of River Trusts and Drainage Boards. The Trusts will disappear with the repealing of the River Trust Act 1940, due to happen mid next year. I attended an LGAQ Executive meeting in Brisbane late last month where this development was part of the agenda for discussion, followed the next day by the AGM of the

State Council of River Trusts, again a forum where this item was a main point of discussion.

As a result of these two meetings, it is proposed to form a group consisting of members from the River Trusts, Local Government Association of Queensland, Department of Infrastructure and Planning and the Department of Environment and Resource Management to have input into the new Local Government Act. The reason for this action is that the State has indicated that the way to continue the work of Trusts is via the local council. The councils do have the necessary mechanisms to do this work, but currently lack the legislated power that is in the River Trust Act now. Some of these powers are around the capacity to mobilise quickly after flooding events, Section 11's which are to do with the transfer of "ownership" of riparian land, the power to enforce a precept on the local government (a demand for an annual funding amount, in the case of CRC \$200,000) and the requirement of a contribution from from the riparian landholder. If these powers can be amalgamated into the new Local Government Act, then this problem could most likely be dealt with, but the time for this is right now. Similarly, the issue of Drainage Boards needs to be dealt with concurrently.

I am heavily involved with this and will keep interested parties involved as we progress. It is important that the work of both Trusts and Drainage Boards continues in our super wet belt of North Queensland.

How Babinda Got Its Name By George Stanley Jago

When the railway line was extended from Harvey Creek to Babinda Creek in 1910, the stop at Weinert's Creek was known by that name, and the terminus on the southern side of Babinda Creek, was call Babinda Creek. The population of the area was about 100 and the business centre of Babinda Creek Hotel, WJ Munro's Butcher Shop and Davies & Stopp's General Store, were all on the eastern side of the road and the southern side of Weinert's Creek.

With the passing of the Sugar Works Act of 1911, money was authorised, and advanced, to build a sugar mill in the Babinda Creek area, to open up the lands of the Russell River. Tenders were called and work commenced in 1914, and it was ready for crushing when the mill commenced on 15th September 1915, to crush 47014 tons of cane for the 1915 season. With the building on the mill, land was required for a town to house the workers and their families. Land was resumed from Portions 422, 383 and 46V and the resumed land was called Potion 12. This was then subdivided into 14 sections, which in turn were re-subdivided into allotments. Areas were set aside for a school and a hospital, and government departments such as Police and Court House, and Post Office. This land then became known as the "Township of Babinda" and became administered by a town agent. The first public auction of land in this township was held on 13th May 1915.

Owners of land adjacent to the town also got in to the act. JJ Parry subdivided land in Portion 46V, called it "Hollywell" and, had an auction on 30th April 1915 – before the Township auction. JE Christian subdivided land on the eastern side of the Cairns Road and WJ Munro subdivided land to become Martin St. The railway line was extended to Moolaba (Pawngilly) and the stop on Weinert's Creek became known as Babinda – creek being dropped from the name. So the town was named after the creek.

On 1st September 1881, Isaac Duffin, Bailiff of Crown Lands, issued a Proclamation giving a description of a block of land as:- "Commencing at a tree marked M on a road from Cairns to Johnston where it crosses a creek called O'Connell Creek, thence down the north bank of the creek about 80 chains thence N thence W to a road thence S along road to a point of connect to contain 640 acres. O'Connell Creek is between three and four miles southerly from Frenchman's Creek is a broad sandy creek with very little water in it.

This block of land in Portion 422, and the Proclamation was issued in response to Application to Lease before Survey, made by Michael O'Connell, Postmaster at Cairns. The lease was granted to O'Connell on 7th August 1883, but he forfeited it on 29th May 1890. In 1891 Portion 422 was proclaimed into 4 sub-divisions of approximately 160 acres each. Karl Weinert then made Application to Lease before Survey, of the northern section of 160 acres, and this was granted on 4th January 1892 after the survey by T Behan was completed on 21st November 1891. Part of this land became part of the Township of Babinda. The southern part of Portion 422 became known as 422A.

South across the creek was another large tract of land. It was called Portion 460 after the number on the Application to Lease before Survey made by William Henry Pettett, address given as Cairns. This application was 12th October 1883, approval on 14th November 1883, and a lease issued on 18th January at an annual fee of 128 pound (\$256), but was forfeited on 25th August 1886. On a letter dated 7th June 1886 from Pettett requesting forfeiture of this lease, he stated that the land was on Babinda Creek, and his address shown on the letter was 'Babinda – Nyngan NSW.'

William Henry Pettett when he applied for the lease, gave his address as Cairns as it was necessary to be a Queensland resident. He later gave his postal address as C/- Geo Newman, Aloomba, and his occupation as 'Gentleman'. He actually was a co-owner in the partnership of Pettett and Cameron who owned a sheep station called Babinda about 15 kilometres from Nymagee, which was the nearest Post Office. The Station buildings are at Latitude 31.56 Longitude 146.29. Babinda Lookout is at Lat 31.57 Lon 146.3, and this may be Babinda Hills. Babinda is in the County of Flinders as shown on an 1892 Geographical Encyclopaedia. The 1882 stock return from Cobar district, showed 'New Babinda' owned by Pettett and Cameron as having 13100 sheep. However, the 1883 return shows that the 'Babinda station' owned by Pettett and Cameron, had 25 horses, 50 cattle, and 12295 sheep grazing on 50000 acres. It would thus seem that the name of Babinda came from NSW. 'Babinda' station in the Wellington District was in existence from at least 1866, as it is listed as owned by Morehead and Young with an area of 64000 acres with a grazing capacity of 4000 sheep. In the same year 'Babinda N' is listed exactly the same. Is this one or two stations?

You, the people of Babinda, under the auspices of the RSL, built the Hall destroyed by Larry. Although this new hall has been paid for by insurance, Australia wide RSL contributions and generous public Donations, you still retain a moral ownership.

We expect the new hall to meet our needs into the foreseeable future. But to meet our collective needs, we must know what they are. That's where the Citizens/Peoples Management Committee comes in. Aside from providing a venue for social events, what else is wanted?

Licensing Laws forbid the bringing of alcohol by individuals. To comply with the law, several members of Lions have, at Lions expense completed the required courses to allow the proper & legal presentation of alcoholic liquor.

A new lift is on order from Europe to give disabled access to the Mezzanine balcony. The mezzanine will also accommodate an office for the RSL and offices for government employees handling any emergency event.

Neither Federal nor State government, despite promises made in Babinda immediately after cyclone Larry has contributed a cent to the cost of the new hall. They did however, insist that the design provide for emergency evacuation needs: number of toilets, showers, power generation, water and catering along with stores. Needless to say, the cost escalated. No doubt governments will to pay a generous monthly rent for the conditions we have provided.

And so, good people, we aging RSL members are appealing for your help in setting up your management committee. Things to be considered include insurance, hire fees, event scheduling, venue cleaning, provision for maintenance to name a few.



Babinda still coming under the umbrella of Gordonvale service. Due to a flooding of the highway in 1986, Babinda Hospital undertook to cook the meals. and in 1992, Marg Moller held a meeting to start Babindas' own service, independent of Gordonvale. That first management committee consisted of, Betty Satchwill (President), Amy Walters (Treasurer/Roster), and Marg Moller (Secretary/co-ordinater),

Betty has become our 1st.volunteer to complete 25 years. Many have completed 20 years Congratulations to those people. Well done. Many thanks to all our volunteers and to our hospital kitchen staff who work tirelessly in the background.

Curtis Pitt MP Member for Mulgrave Working group to address Babinda Medical Services

I am pleased to advise that the medical model for Babinda is moving ahead and I have been working closely with Cairns and Hinterland Health Service CEO, Julie Hartley-Jones, to ensure that the views of the community have been fully taken into consideration.

As an interim measure, Dr Andrew Clift a locum who has previously worked in Babinda, has commenced work and will remain until Christmas, receiving additional support from doctors from the Innisfail Hospital. This will ensure that there is adequate medical cover for the community while the new medical model is progressed and will also allow for continuity of care.

Although Dr Brian Merlo has finally ceased practising, the surgery will not close. The State Government has given a commitment to lease the surgery for the next three months while an independent valuation of the private GP practice is undertaken.

The community has indicated its desire that Queensland Health takes into consideration the long and dedicated contribution by Dr Merlo when arriving at its offer.

Recruiting is now underway for three full-time doctors with advertisements placed for a Medical Superintendent and for two Medical Officers, all with the right of private practice.

The Babinda community has been formally invited to provide a representative to sit on the recruitment panel for the three new Babinda doctors.

I know this is an important issue for residents and I will continue to work with Queensland Health, community representatives and the Far North Queensland Rural Division of General Practice until the model has been implemented.

Secret Cook

Although cooked in a loaf tin, this load is as moist as if cooked in the popular nut roll tin. The secret is in aluminium-foil covering before baking:

½ lb. Dates

1 Egg

1 Cup Boiling Water

11/2 cups self-raising

4oz. Butter or substitute

1 Cup Plain Flour

1 Cup Sugar

½ Cup Of Chopped Walnuts

½ Teaspoon Salt

Chop Dates roughly, add to boiling water, boil for 3 minutes. Stir in butter, sugar, and salt, Blend until butter just melts. When cold, stir in sifted flours alternately with beaten egg. Stir in nuts. Put in greased 23 by 12cm loaf tin. Cover with foil allow for expansion; Press foil firmly round rim of tin to seal completely. Pierce top of foil once with skewer. Bake in mod. Slow oven 1 to 1 1/4 hrs. Remove foil, bake for further 10min.

God Bless the Cassowary—our rainforest gardener. Cassowaries are large flightless birds nearly 2 metres tall. They are considered and important species for the survival of the rainforest. Cassowaries are known to disperse the seed of at least 150 rainforest plants. The Quandong and the Cassowary Plum are so big only this bird is big enough to swallow it whole. Once swallowed the seed passes through unharmed and is ready to germinate. Seeds are often collected from their scats for vegetation projects as they are more likely to germinate. The rainforest surrounding our area here in Babinda is home to the Cassowary and should you sight a bird, it will be for you an uplifting experience.

Babinda District Community Association Inc Presidents Report 2008/2009 Debra Quabba

It is with great pleasure that I present my report on what is the 10th Anniversary of the establishment of this organisation. It only seems like yesterday that the community came together as one and decided to fight for the very existence of our wonderful community, and as a result of many years of hard work we now boast what is essentially the only working Rural Transaction Centre in Australia that includes a Centrelink Agency, Queensland Rail Ticketing Agency, a community meeting place, computer training and internet access, visiting solicitor, Cairns Regional Council representative, Cr Gregory and more recently Curtis Pitt MP and much, much more and still remains unfunded in terms of wages and assistance with electricity and telephone. We are proudly continuing to print a monthly newsletter and a yearly local Telephone Book. We continue to lobby for support from all levels of Government on a range of issues from Street litter to provision of health services for our community and I can say that sometimes we have been unsuccessful in our bid for assistance, but we have always put up the good fight and will continue to do so, given the opportunity.

We continue strong relationships with our lessee's, which include Marino Moller Lawyers, Bendigo Community Bank, terrain Natural Resource Management and Stella Florist and Gift Gallery. We also have continued bookings for our Spirit of Babinda Hall from groups and organisations which include Healthier Great Green Way, Eyedentity, Mamu, Tai Chi, Powerlink, Red Cross, Liberal National Party, and Youth Justice Conferencing. Community groups who meet in the fall free of charge include Babinda Pensioners and Superannuates League, Cootharinga, Farming for the Future, Russell Landcare and Catchment Group, Meals on Wheels, Abbeyfield, Deb Ball Committee and dancing lessons to name a few. We have also held community meetings and events in the hall including Munro St/Bruce Highway meeting, Seniors Expo, and Community Health Services Meeting.

In November last year an executive committee meeting decided to purchase 10 new computers for the computer room which are used as not only as an internet café but a training facility. Unfortunately we will be losing our classes in January due to lack of ongoing funding, but hopefully we will be able to attract a new service provider and continue education in our community.

We have received Q150 Grant Funding to record Oral Histories of significant weather events and we have decided to limit these experiences to the 1918, 1956 (Agnes), 1986 (Winifred) and 2006 (Larry) cyclone experiences. The project was to have been taken up by the school but staffing arrangements changed and time got away from them so we have decided to go ahead with the project ourselves and to set up a Babinda specific Website to upload our interviews and to give a broader based insight into what it is that has shaped our community in terms of the weather.

We have also received a Powerlink Grant which was to have been completed by the end of September but our tradesman has been a little on the busy side so it is in the process of being completed as we speak. The grant was to place a water proof cover of the Disabled Access to the Spirit of Babinda Hall.

We had an application to the Department of Communities for a senior's event but we were unsuccessful. However in March this year we put together a Seniors Expo where groups and organisations showcased their products and services to the seniors in our community. The function was unfortunately not well attended but the morning was a complete success for those that did attend.

We had also received funding the previous year to undertake an Under 5's event from Mission Australia which we had considered returning due to lack of volunteers. This event was also sadly under attended but was a fabulous success for our community. A bus was hired to bring community members from Yarrabah and although we had a date clash those that came had a great morning.

This years Tidy Towns entry resulted in a win for our community being awarded the Regions Tidiest Town. We have been quite successful with our entries over the years, which, proves a very high level of community spirit, awareness of the environment, and a commitment to the future of our area.

It continues to amaze me that our 2 staff who are paid a total of 35 hours per week and 3 volunteers can achieve the volume of work that is achieved out of this office. Their dedication and commitment to not only the organisation but the community is a credit to them and I thank them for their many hours of hard work over the last twelve months.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the executive committee who are extremely supportive of me and the never ending trail of ideas and projects that I embark upon daily and weekly. So a huge thankyou must go to them.

No organisation that undertakes the level of community work that the Taskforce does would be able to do this without the support of outside assistance. This support for us comes in the shape of Cr Gregory. Cr Gregory has and is the person that I turn to for advice and knowledge about a range of subjects. His commitment not only to me, but the Taskforce and our community is unquestionably of the highest level and I am extremely grateful for everything he does. Without his guidance and support we certainly would not be able to achieve the many things that we do. Thank you, Paul.

The future of the organisation is unfortunately unstable due to ongoing financial commitments but it is without doubt we have become an essential part of our community and it would be reprehensible to allow financial constraints to be our undoing.

On that note I would like to congratulate the new committee on their election and I hope that your experiences in the community will give you great satisfaction and pleasure.
