POLICE NEWS

Another month and another two rescues from Josephine falls. I was standing at the car park going on midnight watching the latest rescued people being treated by QAS and counted three fire appliances, two QAS vehicles and the police vehicle. I counted at least a dozen fire officers two paramedics, one ranger and obviously one police officer. I had just watched two QFRS officers risk their lives rescuing these two people in the middle of the night from the flooded torrent and thought to myself, where has our common sense and sense of responsibility gone. Is the concept that difficult that if there is inclement weather you do not go swimming at Josephine Falls, or any local creeks for that matter. Despite the numerous signs and media attention people are just not getting the message. As emergency service personnel it is our job to respond to these situations and to protect life, but I perhaps am more perplexed by the flippant attitudes of those people who have just been plucked from a near death experience. On a related matter I have also been noticing of late also that children are swimming in excessively swollen creeks especially near Rotary Park on Babinda Creek. If you kids wish to go swimming unsupervised ask them where they are going and what time they will be back. A little bit of parental supervision goes a long way to preventing a tragedy.

Lastly I am going on Long service leave for the duration January and February 2011 and Senior Constable Barry ANDERSON from Mourilyan will be reliving my position. I hope you all have a Merry Christmas and a great new year.

So if you are looking for a different Christmas gift for the person who has everything consider something outside the square : if the person you are giving a gift to does not have the number of their house out the front either on the letterbox or a place easily seen buy them the numbers of their property/house and make them clearly visible. They are cheap and effective. This will really help us particularly when it is dark or raining heavily. In the case of an emergency seconds can count. The pre-inquest hearings indicated that Council needed to reinforce safety measures around the Devil's Pool section of the park, which has been complied with by the "No Go" designation of a small section of Babinda Creek. There were already signs warning people of the dangers of entering the water at this point, but now the introduction of this policy means local law officers can order swimmers out of the water, and if not complied with, an on the spot fine of \$200 can be issued. While this may appear heavy handed, the fine will of course be a last resort. This regime will not be imposed until January next year, as Council will be only warning people who don't comply in the interim as an educational measure.

Measures like these can upset many people who see their rights being eroded, but I guess the most important point is that human life is sacred, and all attempts must be made to ensure public safety. Locals will know not to go

swimming there anyway as the spot is notoriously dangerous during the rainy period, and visitors such as James

Bennett need to be made fully aware of what can result from their actions. Terrible family tragedies last in the relative's memories for a lifetime, and the fewer of such cases, the better.

The wet weather has made the end of the cane crush an absolute nightmare, so my thoughts go out to fellow farmers. We can only hope for better times next year.

On that note, Seasons Greetings to all, and I look forward to catching up after a break over Christmas.

The membership is diverse too. Men from all backgrounds, ethnic and social mixes can enjoy a Men's Shed, bringing their unique cultural characteristics to enliven the activities.

The common theme in all Sheds is about men feeling useful and contributing again to their communities, learning or sharing their skills, making friend, networking and availing themselves of health information programmes and opportunities. Men's Sheds are under the auspices of a variety of organisations whose ethos they tend to exemplify.

Communities are keen to provide activity, identity and meaning for vast numbers of older, unemployed, job-redundant, 'downsized', isolated, depressed and happily retired, active, creative, enthusiastic men. Men's Sheds are fast being recognized as vital, viable places to fulfil these needs and provide relaxed, happy creative spaces for men to enjoy.

Parliament passes laws to strengthen state's sentencing regime

A package of reforms that strengthens Queensland's criminal sentencing regime has been passed by Parliament. The amendments to the *Penalties and Sentences Act 1992* include laws to establish the state's first sentencing advisory council.

The new laws are part of the State Government's continued strengthening of the state's sentencing regime to ensure it reflects community expectations. Our new laws ensure that offenders convicted of sexual offences against children under 16 years old must serve an actual term of imprisonment unless there are exceptional circumstances.

The amendments also target offenders who repeatedly break the law, by enshrining the principle that judges and magistrates must treat each relevant previous conviction as an aggravating factor when determining penalties. An offender's criminal history is an important factor when setting penalties, to show whether the offence was an uncharacteristic lapse or an ongoing disregard for the law.

While it must be acknowledged that sentencing is one of the most complex tasks facing judges and magistrates, these reforms reflect the community expectation that the previous convictions of repeat offenders should be taken into account when determining an appropriate sentence.

The new laws compel the court to treat the age of a child victim of a violent offence or an offence that causes the death of a child as an aggravating factor when determining whether an offender should be declared a serious violent offender. This will require judges to recognise the disproportionate power of an adult over a young child and the much lower level of force needed to cause serious injury.

The reforms also pave the way for the establishment of a sentencing advisory council which will give the community greater involvement in the sentencing process. Members of the public and victims of crime will have a voice on the new sentencing advisory council, along with experts in law enforcement, criminal law, and juvenile and Indigenous justice issues.

What a great year! In 2011 we continue to implement our two key areas of school improvement defined by the Triennial School Review of 2008 - curriculum and behaviour. Curriculum-wise, we will continue to focus on English, literacy and numeracy. In addition, we will start to explore the National Curriculum in the areas of P-10 Mathematics and P-10 History. Behaviour and what we value? While our NAPLAN results are commendable, we can do much better. Student improvement relies on our partners in education – the students and their parents. Continued improvement is dependent on attendance and the completion of assessment. Most importantly, students must attend all lessons. Each day I hear "I slept in Mrs Moore!" "I had to help Mum with the shop-No! That's not OK!

Many Babinda State School P-12 students are repeatedly missing a literacy or numeracy lesson. Over a week, these students are missing one or two new concepts. Over a term it grows - 20 new concepts. Since these lessons build on each other, the situation is only aggravated. If you want your child to be the best they can be - and we certainly do - ensure that they are at school, on time, every day! Keep in mind, regardless of the reasons for nonattendance – valid or invalid - no additional resources are allocated to schools to help students 'catch up'. Limited resources are simply spread more thinly!

The second issue for 2011, is the completion of assessment. Assessment serves a number of purposes. Firstly, it allows teachers to know how your child is going on things the teacher has just taught and then adjust teaching to improve Secondly, and importantly, assessment provides a summary of how your child has gone over an entire Semester so that they can report that to you and to 'the system'— this data stays with students throughout their schooling. When students 'skip' assessment days or do not complete assessment items, teachers do not have the 'evidence of learning'. Those students are marked down. More than ever before, assessment is important. If your son or daughter says "We've finished" or "We're not doing any more tests", please check. Ring the school! 2011 is our third year of implementation of the Triennial School Review goals – goals set by the Babinda community. Please support us in continuing to meet those targets.



NEWS FROM BABINDA SES

from Don Lawie

Three of our most frequent activation sites (apart from The Boulders) are the Golden Hole, Josephine Falls and the Bartle Frere Track. These are all overshadowed by Bartle Frere mountain and radio communication in the area is very difficult. Long before my time in SES, our people discovered an open paddock at Bartle Frere which offers superb radio transmission. Now, whenever an activation occurs at any of the above sites, we set up in the paddock with a petrol generator, long and short range radios and various supplies. During a search for a missing walker a couple of years ago I was able to relay messages from the paddock to Search Base at the Josephine parking area and also to SES HQ in Cairns and Malanda and with two search teams on the mountain.

The only disadvantage with this open paddock is that it rains just about every day of the year. We have a need for a light, easily erected rain/sun shelter at the radio site and also at Search Base. These shelters have now been obtained and are stowed in our ready-use trailer, awaiting our next call to duty. Finance for the shelters was supplied through the generosity of Babinda's Community Bank, with whom we do our banking business and who already support us by paying interest on our fund-rasing money via a no-bank-charge account. Thank you, Babinda Community Bank!
