You may have noticed some new road works starting on the intersection of the Bruce Highway and Munro Street recently.

For those that are not aware this is to widen the road to allow for a pedestrian refuge to be constructed in the middle of the Highway and to make crossing a lot safer. I think this is a great project and one that will be very beneficial to the whole town. For the duration of construction the speed limit will be changed to 40kph during business hours and will revert to 60 kph during the evening. The engineers responsible for the project have asked for everyone's co operation with this and for police to enforce this speed limit so please be mindful when driving through the works. Hopefully weather permitting this should be completed in the coming months.

On another note I have noticed of late that a number of people seem to think that it is OK to walk around town of a night consuming liquor. Not only will the persons consuming the liquor be liable to a \$100 on the spot fine but often the empty containers are left strewn though out the parks and vicinity for someone else to clean up. Please be aware that police have the power to issues an on the spot fine and tip out the contents of the container. If you are found drinking all unopened containers that you may have in your possession will also be tipped out. Cairns Regional Council Notes By Paul Gregory

Hi From Cairns Regional Council

There is significant debate occurring in Council over the formulation of our budget....what a surprise!

The press has recently run a large spread on how we as a group are going to deal with the situation that confronts us on the local economic front; that is, high unemployment, a stagnant property market, and the fallout from the GFC still impacting on tourism numbers.

Like it or not, we are reliant on the tourist industry, as the primary and secondary industries that had been the backbone of our economy have been dwarfed by the giant increases in people who have visited us to see the natural attractions we take for granted. The fishing industry (Cairns at one stage in recent history had one of the largest commercial fleets in Australia) has waned under regulatory pressures, timber has gone, and sugar, whilst bouyant at present, has seen some reduction in size with the urban growth that has followed the growth in tourism. One only has to think back on how many local mills have gone in the last 20 years (Hambledon started the slide back in 1991) to put this in perspective.

As a result, any slowdown in tourism immediately impacts on our local economy. As such, the councillors really need to think very carefully what is important to residents at this time to ensure that the rate money provided is put to good use. Public debate has mainly focussed on whether or not the current budget should be visionary and expansive, or be modest and cautious.

I am firmly on the side of the latter. I make no apology for stating that we need to concentrate firmly on service provision that has long been associated with Councils, and leave the big, visionary projects for better times. Sure, let's plan for the things that will provide extra enjoyment in our lives, but to commit to long term capital spends currently is to my mind not responsible. I am of course talking about such things as the performing arts centre, which is going to be a jewel in the crown of the far north, but I question the need to commit ratepayers money at this stage until we are sure that other levels of government are putting their money on the table. We need to know how much that will be, and the subsequent burden that ratepayers will need to shoulder.

Anyway, more on this as the debate develops.

AMBULANCE NEWS

Welcome to another month. I was depressed about the weather until today. It is cut off day for stories to the newsletter and it is the best weather in two months. Reminds you why we live here - it is nice and green, friendly and while the Victorians are about to freeze as we are basking in beautiful sunshine. Peter is away at the moment on leave and Steve Gulliver from Cairns is replacing him. He has done a few stints here in the past 8 months and he must like the place as he has come back for more. Thanks Steve. When the new ambulance station was built there was no casualty room in the plans. Many would remember when we syringed ears, took steel out of eyes and did heaps of re dressings. We simply do not have the equipment anymore supplied to us - large stainless syringes, high powered optical lights and goggles etc. The reason we do not have casualty rooms anymore is for a number of reasons: legal purposes - you require specialised treatment and equipment when dealing with eyes and if a mistake is made the QAS may be liable and the officer may face disciplinary charges if you perform a task which you have not been trained for. Another reason is the fact that we focus more as a department on primary pre hospital care and patient transport. Unlike the old days when we would work all night and then be expected to turn up at work at 07 00 no matter how fatigued you were we now are left at home with a break and the communications centre calls us when we have to respond to a job. It makes doing drug calculations easier when you have a clear mind. We are fortunate that there is a hospital located next door which is staffed 24 hours a day. If you turn up on our doorstep with a nasty cut or something we will always help anyone who needs it but are limited. As I earlier mentioned it is possible that we are not on station having been on fatigue or on another case. I would hate for someone to sit here bleeding profusely whilst we might be on a case at Fishery Falls. If you do require an ambulance there is a phone located on the wall which will connect you directly to our communications centre. They will give you advice and contact us or the nearest ambulance. Hope we only see you on a social basis. In an emergency call 000 or non emergency 13 12 33.

MULGRAVE SETTLERS' MUSEUM OPEN DAY

The Mulgrave Settlers; Museum held an Open Day on 29 April to showcase this year's Special Display of historical items relating to the sugar industry. Items on display include farm and Mill records and a range of farming equipment of yesteryear.

The Museum, in Gordonvale, has recently been donated World War Two uniforms once worn by QX33570 Sgt. Bill Kerns, a farmer from Bellenden Ker who fought in the Battle of Porton Plantation. The Museum committee have handed the items on to Babinda and Gordonvale RSL, Sub Branches and to 51 Battalion at Edmonton. Two greatcoats and a Battledress jacket were presented at the Museum Open Day on 29 April and were accepted by Mrs Maureen Raddatz on behalf of Babinda RSL and Lt. Col. Steve Brain, Commanding Officer of 51 Battalion.

The Porton battle involved an attack by men of 31/51 Battalion A.I.F.—men from Townsville and Cairns areas—in an attempt to oust Japanese troops from northern Bougainville in June 1945.

The attack was a failure; the troops were to land from the sea but their barges were stranded on offshore reefs and they had to wade ashore without heavy weapons or supplies. They were pinned down in a tight perimeter by overwhelming numbers of Japanese, but managed to hold on to their position and fight back for two days. New Zealand Air Force flew protective cover by F4U Corsair fighters, and R.A.A.F. Boomerangs bombed the Japanese positions. The Australian artillery of 2/4 Field Regiment, firing from an offshore island, landed 25 pound shells just in front of the perimeter under the direction of a Gunner Officer ashore with the 31/51 men.

The withdrawal and rescue were epics of Aussie courage and endurance. The rescue barges were stranded on reefs and the unit commander, Captain Downs, lost his life protecting his wounded. Japanese attacks were incessant, day and night, until finally relief barges took off all soldiers still alive. Overall there were 132 killed or wounded out of the 190 Diggers involved.

The battle is commemorated by 51 Battalion at Edmonton's Porton Barracks in June each year with a parade and Memorial Ceremony. Many Babinda district men have served in 51 Battalion over the years.

Queensland Health to purchase Babinda GP practice

Queensland Health has agreed to purchase the Babinda private GP practice to fulfil a commitment to the community to guarantee the future of the town's medical services.

The community indicated at a meeting last September that the preferred model for sustainable medical care is an integrated and collaborative approach between the public and the private health systems, providing both primary and secondary care.

The late Dr Brian Merlo provided the Babinda community with more than 30 years of dedicated service. A commitment was made to the Babinda community in November last year that the Queensland Government would purchase his practice to ensure that medical cover continues to be provided to the local community and to ensure his legacy lived on.

As part of the commitment to develop sustainable medical services at Babinda, Queensland Health last year undertook to recruit three full-time doctors to service the needs of the Babinda community and hospital. The positions are a Medical Superintendent with Right of Private Practice and two Medical Officers with Right of Private Practice who will work in both the public and private sector, providing medical cover at the GP practice and at Babinda Hospital.

A town the size of Babinda usually requires 2.6 Full Time Equivalent doctors to meet the needs of patients at both the hospital and the GP practice. However, it was decided to recruit three full-time doctors to ensure all the community's needs were met. Respected community member Fred Lizzio participate in the recruitment and selection process.

Last week I was pleased to announce that Dr Amador Ibanez-Almarche has been appointed as Medical Superintendent with Right of Private Practice at Babinda. He will be taking up his new position on 1 July. Dr Ibanez-Almarche currently is a Senior Medical Officer at Mareeba Hospital. Finalisation of the recruitment for the remaining two Medical Officer with Right of Private Practice positions is underway.

I'm really pleased to see the pieces are now falling into place as part of the larger medical model for Babinda. Putting this model in place was my number one priority for Babinda at the last election so I'm glad to see this coming together.

The agreement to purchase the private practice and recruitment of doctors has been the result of a group effort by a number of parties. This outcome was achieved through close collaboration between myself, the Cairns and Hinterland Health Service District, the Babinda Community, the Merlo family, the Office of Rural and Remote Health and the Far North Queensland Rural Division of General Practice.

I would like to thank everyone involved for helping to achieve this excellent outcome for the Babinda community.

At our Information night we all enjoyed a very interesting talk by local fish enthusiast Russell Constable followed by refreshments and general chitchat.

Natural Resource Awareness Grant

We have been working on a Natural Resource Awareness project to look at reducing our carbon footprint through the carbon captured and held within a growing tree. We often plant trees within our landscape to provide habitat, to stabilise creek banks, suppress weed growth and improve visual amenity. As these trees grow they capture carbon and store it for the life of the tree. A 20 year old eucalypt tree of about 37cm diameter and 20m tall would hold about 1 tonne of carbon dioxide equivalent which is the unit used to measure greenhouse benefit.

You easily work out how many kilograms of carbon dioxide your family produces each year at http://www.abc.net.au/tv/carboncops/calculator.htm. You may actually find it is easier to cut emissions than to try to find enough land to plant trees to recapture them!



Here's one for the busy volunteer. **KEDGEREE**

At breakfast time place 50g of brown rice in a thermos flask, almost fill the flask with boiling water. By dinner time at night the rice will be cooked and still warm.

Place into a frying pan: 1 Tab olive oil, 1 Tab butter. Add: cooked rice, 125g flaked cooked fish of choice and heat through, white of a boiled egg or two, chopped coarsely. Season with lemon pepper and nutmeg, salt if fish not salty. Serve garnished with mashed egg yolk and parsley, with lemon wedges on the side.

The thermos trick also works with dried legumes and dried fruit. (I haven't tried it to boil eggs yet)

Vary with cooked chicken or pork instead of fish.. Use up left over vegies.

I This is so quick, unless you are well organised you won't have time for a pre-dinner tipple.

"Bowel Cancer: Tackle It Before It Tackles You!"

Bowel Cancer Awareness Week, held from June 6-13 this year, aims to raise public awareness of bowel cancer prevention and early detection. Although bowel cancer is one of the most treatable cancers if detected early, it still claims the lives of 80 Australian men and women every week.

The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program aims to reduce these mortality rates by sending home-testing kits, the Faecal Occult Blood Test (FOBT), to men and women turning 50, 55 or 65 between 2008 and 2010. For those who receive a kit, you are encouraged to participate. And for those who are not yet eligible for the Program, it is important to look out for any symptoms and discuss any concerns you may have with your GP.

Participants who receive a positive result on the FOBT are referred for colonoscopy. Results of Program participants presenting to a Queensland Health facility show just over 50% have pre-cancerous cells detected and treated, and a significant 5% have bowel cancer detected and treated.

Interestingly, men, are 58% more likely to develop bowel cancer than women, yet are 1.2 times less likely to participate in the Program.

Prevention also has a huge part to play. Simple lifestyle behaviours like regular physical activity, eating healthy, reducing alcohol intake and quitting smoking can prevent up to 75% of bowel cancers.

Why are you a school chaplain?

I long to help young people live out their potential and live a fulfilling, successful life. I personally have found in my own life, that living a fulfilling life comes through being a Christian – having a relationship with Jesus. However I am not here to push that view on anyone. My role is to help guide students through life and offer practical, emotional, mental and spiritual support should they seek it.
