Contracts for Babinda businesses to continue

Small businesses everywhere are doing it tough right now and they need every bit of help we can give them. So I was deeply concerned when I discovered that existing suppliers from Babinda were overlooked in the awarding of contracts to supply goods and services to Babinda hospital.

I was informed that the Babinda suppliers missed the boat because Queensland Health failed to notify local businesses that contracts were being let. Although not intentional, this was obviously not good enough, and after speaking with the local business operators I took my concerns to Health Minister Geoff Wilson.

By that time, the tendering process had been finalised and the contracts awarded to suppliers out of the local area. But then the most amazing thing happened. I was pleased to learn that during discussions all four of the larger suppliers who had successfully won the contract were sympathetic to the recent adverse impacts on the Babinda community in the wake of Cyclone Yasi and closure of the Babinda Mill.

The result? The large suppliers withdrew their offers of supplying the Babinda Hospital of their produce, to allow local babinda-based suppliers to maintain economy within the community.

Under the rules, Queensland Health does not need to re-tender the food contracts for the hospital due to the low value of each contract - purchase orders have now been released to the Babinda vendors and this arrangement will continue until September 2013.

Local businesses need all the support we can give them. I am grateful to Tootie and Wendy Nucifora, Helen Fantoni and other local residents who raised this issue with me and for enabling me to get involved on their behalf. But I'm especially grateful to the four suppliers who agreed to withdraw their offers in acknowledgement of the tough times currently being experienced. It goes to show that we live in a pretty great part of the world with pretty generous people.

Hi from CRC.

Council has brought down the 2011-12 budget, and once again the process was long and much laboured over. This time, there are some underlying, background circumstances that seem to be affecting our community that makes trying to balance sound fiscal decisions and community expectations particularly difficult.

Currently, our region is struggling financially; the lingering effects of the Global Financial Crisis, the disastrous La Nina event with associated flooding and cyclones (that have impacted on agriculture and tourism), and most importantly, the fact that we do not gain the positives of the resources boom enjoyed by communities further to our south like Townsville and Mackay. Families are seriously feeling the pinch, with rising power costs being symptomatic of the escalating cost of living; another impact will be insurance costs after this summers events.

Council is aware of this, and has tried to frame a budget that does not totally transfer these increasing costs onto ratepayers. The rate rise has been kept to a realistic minimum, although complete equity in rises has been confounded by the recent property valuations that have delivered a mixed bag of rises and falls to individual properties. For the first time the total unimproved values for our region have fallen; this creates the problem for council of striking a rate in the dollar that captures the increased costs for council to provide the basic services, while at the same time recognising that the unimproved value of individual properties may have fallen. This fact alone has created enormous debate and many different rating models put before councillors to discuss, trying to find a way that does not negatively impact on as many residents as possible. This has proven to be an almost impossible task, and there will be winners and losers in the rating department again this budget. Council has decided to shoulder a lot of the burden itself, carrying an unbalanced budget forward, with a manageable deficit the result of many negotiations among councillors with the Queensland Treasury Corporation providing advice along the way.

In this issue, the update on the mill closure is reported in depth, and a good initiative stemming from this is the publishing of the Frequently Asked Questions report. This information will be provided to the community on an ongoing basis; please feel free to contact me for further discussion if you feel the need.

Most Frequently Asked Questions

Question	Answer	
Chimney - Can we keep it?	No, due to safety and structural reasons. However there may be an opportunity to keep the top half and move it to a suitable location within the town or integrate it within the site redevelopment.	
What do Main Roads say about another road access?	Option currently being investigated with Main Roads. Initial discussions indicate positive response to access the site.	
Mill houses, will they be retained or will they go?	The houses are an asset on the site and have value and will be retained.	
Is the site contaminated?	Drillers are currently engaged to run bore hole testing. Anticipates that remediation will not be found to be significant-testing will identify issues to determine extent of remediation required.	
How were the suggestions from the Peter Kenyon workshop used?	The list of suggestions at the workshop will be directly referred to in the development of proposals for the site. The group will be carefully testing the feasibility of all proposals for the site.	
Will the existing toilets be refurbished?	Not in the short term due to operation of the Mill crush.	
How long will it take to get the existing building demolished?	This is a long process that will take up to two years.

NEWS FROM BABINDA S E S

from Don Lawie

Safety is one item that permeates all of our training; an injured volunteer is of no use and requires time and personnel to evacuate. The SES manual has "doctrines" that we have to follow in all circumstances to minimise danger to ourselves and to other people involved in our activities.

Following our two cyclones early this year our teams first performed investigative checks as a follow-up to Requests for Assistance. Degree of urgency of each job was calculated and appropriate teams were activated. Householders may have thought that the first visit from SES was unproductive, but it is all part of the procedure to ensure that we perform the most urgent jobs quickly, efficiently and with a minimum of risk to everybody involved.

A "Doctrine Imperative" is that no SES personnel are to go onto or in a roof space unless the electricity has been switched off. If this cannot be done we have to refer the job to other authorities such as Ergon – who are

already flat out. We are also required to have protective gloves, helmets, harness and a safety line to the ground. All SES personnel who work on roofs must have a current Certificate of Competency which has to be renewed by refresher courses at set intervals.

Fallen trees are always a complication of cyclone damage – they can cause powerlines to fall on wet roads or house roofs. Live lines are deadly and we have a "doctrine" for dealing with all fallen lines until we are assured by Ergon or the police that they are safe. Chainsaw operators also have to have a current Certificate, renewed at set intervals. Babinda SES is in the process of organising a chainsaw weekend for this purpose so don't be alarmed if you see us industriously cutting trees and branches – it's just practise to ensure we are ready for the next cyclone season.

All of the above is an explanation for what may seem at first glance a slow response to a call for assistance : we follow the Doctrines which ensure that people in need are cared for with a maximum of safety and efficiency.
