POLICE NEWS

The last month here at the station has been a very busy one for us with everything from a very serious stabbing at Bramston Beach to a lone cow reported running up Munro Street. Constable PARKER has just returned from Brisbane after completing the advanced Forensic crash investigators course. This course is provided to select members and provides them with the necessary skills and qualifications to conduct detailed forensic mapping, and investigations of serious traffic crashes. We also pray that he is not called to utilise these skills anytime soon.

I had the privilege of attending the Disaster Management support officer's conference in Brisbane also over the past month and listened to numerous guest speakers involved in the Brisbane, Grantham, Mackay and Rockhampton floods. We also had our Innisfail District Officer Inspector Tucker and Sergeant Greg Batt present a case study on Cyclone Yasi. The conference allowed the QPS as an organisation to get together share our experiences and learn where we can improve for future events. From all accounts it is the belief of the weather bureau that we can expect to see more of these extreme weather events than ever before in the future and it is something that we as a community need to be prepared for.

Lastly we are receiving a spike in complaints about hooning around our town. Whilst this is good to see people reporting these matters the more information you can give the better. If it is a repeat offender note the times and dates of the incidents and report it to us. It is a common misconception that police have to see the event for the person to be prosecuted. Often the best witnesses are the public themselves so please let us know who the problem children (or adults) are and we will follow it up.

AMBULANCE NEWS

It's been nice and nippy at night lately - I love a cold snap at night with sunny days. It reminds you that it doesn't rain all year and why you choose to live here. It's not that cold that people go putting electric blankets on or have fire places, oil burners so there is no real need to talk about safety regarding them. Having said that safety on our roads and in the home should be everyone's priority. As I write this the state has had its worse day of accidents in a long, long time - 8 fatalities in a day. That's a lot of broken families and friends all over Queensland. It also has a lot of effect on Paramedics. Fire-fighters, Hospital and Police - it's a hard job when ambos have to tell a family a loved one has passed on when we are called to incidents at peoples houses, it must be even harder for the police to knock on someone's door at 2 am with the worst news they will ever hear - especially when someone is in the prime of their life. Local accidents in our area have dropped right off in the past 18 months. 3,4,5 years ago we were getting a lot more accidents both small and medium with a lot of fatalities for a town that services around

2 000 + people. As well as the 2 000 odd people that live in the Babinda catchment area there are twice that many vehicles travelling on the Bruce Highway through town each day.

Peter is getting around town well now and we hope to have him back at work sooner rather later. He has been away from the station a long time now and might need an orientation. He is still doing his normal activities around town supporting the community. I'm looking forward to the Harvest Festival coming up, should be a great weekend for everyone. A lot of effort has gone into it with the organisers, fundraisers and supporters.

Hi from CRC.

The Babinda Harvest Festival has once again been and gone, and what a fantastic couple of weeks were enjoyed by the community. The cabaret two weeks ago, which included the judging of the Harvest Princess', was a great night in the wonderful venue of the new hall. To top that off, last weekends festivities including the parade and the crowning of the winners was conducted in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd in perfect weather......almost to a written script! Congratualtions to the entrants in the quest, as they are absolute credits to their families and the community. It was a great pleasure to be able to meet and interact with the girls, and a special mention must be made about the organisers this year, Frances and Paula. They did an excellent job making the whole event run like clockwork.

Roadworks have been completed in Eastwood Street under the old "Suburban Enhancement Program", which was instigated about 8 years ago by the old pre-amalgamation (with Douglas) council. These works do a couple of things; of course the access and appearance of a streetscape is improved, but more importantly in the long run, the assets within the street (the road surface, kerb and channeling etc) are renewed, and will therefore last much longer. This improves council's depreciation register, and helps financially in the future. Hopefully, little maintenance work will be required there for some years to come.

Also, Council is upgrading the off street parking in Munro Street, including the disabled parking bays that are provided within the area between the Hotel and the Canegrowers buildings. There have been some conflicting views about where people should park and for how long, in the main street. The provision of these new parks, right in the middle of town, should ensure that needs are met for quite a while now.

The steering committee for the town, formed in response to the mill closure, has met again and some real progress is being made. There is an air of cooperation around the table that if continued, will overcome any issues that may get thrown up. The pressing need is to get some land assigned for the grey nomads, and an in-principle agreement has been reached between the site owners (MSF) and council, so the paperwork to get this to happen is underway.

Hope you had an enjoyable Harvest Festival. If you missed us at the pavilions keep reading and learn more about what Russell LandCare and Catchment Group have been doing lately.

There has been some concern for two Cassowaries that have been visiting residents on Jago Street. Please do not feed the Cassowaries or approach them. Be aware that they are crossing the road and slow down when driving to prevent any fatalities. QPWS have been notified. Take care of our Natural Assets, Cassowaries are endangered and their habitats are declining as urbanisation grows. If you see an animal that may be endangered or you haven't seen before in your area please visit The Taskforce and fill in a Sightings Register or email Selena. This data will be recorded and used for further studies to better understand our unique fauna.

Rlcg have recently employed Jason Birch as our Operations Assistant and he is targeting Reef Rescue 4 funding applications. Welcome to the team Jason Birch.

On Monday 30th May Rlcg Project Coordinator Daryl Killin and Jason Birch were out on the field in a kayak using the GPS to record areas of degradation and erosion along Babinda Creek. This data will be used to prioritise work and funding. The result will impact on a Babinda Creek that can better manage the high water levels during the wet season.

All peoples with an interest in Babinda Creek are invited to attend Rlcg Babinda Creek Action Plan Public Forum from 3 pm to 6 pm at The Spirit of Babinda Hall in Babinda, 24th July 2011. This forum is to give Rlcg feedback on "The Babinda Creek Action Plan". Copies of the plan are being circulated in the community and can be viewed at our office, 53 Munro Street Babinda. LUCIANA BERTOLANI commonly called "Luchie" was born in Italy in 1927 and migrated with her mother DONATA to Babinda.



One of the most frequent operations we are requested to perform during extreme wet weather is sandbagging. Water ingress to homes and businesses can often occur due to blocked drains or overflowing gutters and can be prevented by a carefully laid wall of sandbags. Bags are usually made of coarse hessian or pvc, both of which have a limited life in our wet tropical climate. Sandbags can be filled with sand, dirt, gravel or any available bulking material and are not in themselves waterproof. An occluding membrane of black plastic is inserted between courses of bags and the wall is then strong and watertight. Bags are filled to 2/3 full to allow for interlocking overlays and weigh about 18 Kg, more when the filling is wet.

A very large number of bags is required if a sandbag wall is to be built; a wall thirty metres long and 900mm high requires three thousand four hundred bags, and so the decision to make a sandbag wall is a serious one involving much basic material, many bags, and much hard work. At Babinda SES we keep a stock of bags on hand and are glad to issue them to interested members of the public who may wish to protect their own premises. We also have a heap of clean sand supplied by the Council, also available free on application.

Calls on bags can be excessive and we are very grateful to the King family of Miriwinni who have come up with an innovative substitute: they have donated a large number of clean empty chook-food bags to us. These are strong plastic stuff and will be first class for use next time we have a call for sandbags. This is the type of assistance from the public which we really appreciate.

Method:




