We have been receiving a number of complaints from our lolly pop ladies recently that drivers are not heeding the road rules around the schools. The main complaints is that motorists are not stopping when directed, are driving through the crossing before all persons have left the road and are parking in the no standing zones either side of the crossing. It appears that a lot of the offending vehicles are local and are often dropping their own children off. We are also receiving complaints that numerous cars are conducting U turns across the double white lines at the front of the school. I ask that all persons using the school zones before and after school please be extra vigilant and obey all road rules. Our children do behave in the same way adults do around traffic and I would hate to see an injury or even worse. Please make sure you obey the lolly pop ladies directions and wait till al person have left the crossing before driving through. Innisfail Traffic branch are aware of these complaints and will be making patrols over the coming weeks in their unmarked vehicle so please be warned.

We have also received a few complaints in relation to the use of motorised scooters around town. This mainly relates to them being driven at excessive speed on the footpaths, being parked in shop entrances and even being driven down the middle of the main street impeding the flow of traffic. If you own and use one of these scooters please be mindful of the above and considerate of pedestrians and other road users alike.

"Hi from CRC.

Much has been said about Yasi and the response, so I'll leave that one alone and concentrate on Council's response to the announced and subsequent closure of Babinda Mill.

The closure was a commercial decision made by the factory's owners, and Council, like the community, has accepted that at face value and set about finding what can be done to provide the necessary pathways to help a "refocus" rather than a "re-build", which is what we would have been facing had Yasi made landfall here.

Council can help at several levels. Firstly, the immediate community based response to help lift spirits and get residents thinking about a promising future; this is being addressed by the proposed public meeting run be Peter Kenyon for the 9th March. Peter was instrumental in the rebound about 13 years ago when the Taskforce was set up to provide impetus after a depressing period of time in the late 90's. Our community service officers, and the Taskforce will also be helping where they can in partnership with the State departments who will no doubt work hard to ensure residents can see a way forward. Special attention will of course be required for those who have felt the brunt of the loss of their job; immediate support is vital, as is the way to provide long term employment and a positive future.

Secondly, an economic audit will be completed by our Economic Development department to see what is in place already in the area, and what has the potential to expand and flourish. This will be done in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce, who are obviously instrumental in the future economic well being of the town. This team will need to identify possible other opportunities for investment as well, a vital component in the total picture.

Thirdly, and perhaps most importantly, a land use plan for the mill site needs to be developed as quickly as possible. Council has had negotiations with the mill owners who are very supportive, and have employed a consultant town planner to work with the community and the owners to ensure that the required land use areas (the old "zonings") are in place on the mill site to allow trouble and red tape free development opportunities to be available when a party wishes to invest in the town. Some of these uses that have been proposed are grey nomad facilities, industrial, commercial, special facilities (aged care for example), open space and residential to name a few. This process is underway already, and is essential for the well being of the town, and a speedy transition to a bright future.

I must take this opportunity to thank my fellow councillors and all the staff who have very quickly supported my efforts to respond to this recent turn of events. It is fair to say that I am proud of the way that council has responded in a rapid and proactive way. As a community, we need to be positive and see some form of opportunity here to develop a broader base to the local economy. It will be a hard row to hoe, but one that must be tackled.





I missed the extended deadline for "Babinda News" last month – we were on generator power for some time after Yasi, and the bridge to East Russell was flooded for an extended period. Consequently, I was unable to participate in the SES contribution to the cyclone clean-up, but I have a report from our Local Controller Shirley:

Babinda SES had an emergency pre-cyclone meeting. All equipment was checked and ready and we were allotted a second "Troopie" which was stationed at Deputy Group Leader Zac Murphy's house. Zac, along with Shirley and Group Leader Phil Terranova were out patrolling the district at first light after the cyclone had passed and making notes for the most urgent jobs to be done. We were allotted a chainsaw team from Gordonvale SES and a mammoth job of clearing driveways and tarping damaged roofs ensued. Shirley reports that over 64 jobs were completed between Garradunga and Fishery Falls, with well in excess of 160 volunteer hours spent on the job. Dulcie and her team kept the workers fed and supplied, and our new members Jason and Stephen had a very vigorous introduction to SES work with all jobs requiring maximum physical effort in the high temperature and humidity and constant rain.

Shirley is very pleased with Babinda SES's response to the emergency and has asked me to pass on, through "Babinda News", her appreciation of the way that the Team operated.





It is such a pleasure now, to be able to direct them to places such as Paronella Park and Mission Beach where owners have overcome such physical and mental trauma to such an extent that they are now open for business.

As are most Babinda residents, we are still reeling with the news of the Babinda Mill closure. We have such a lot of Babinda Mill memorabilia at the centre and are fully aware of its' value. My memories of growing up in Babinda are synonymous with the mill and its' seasons – sign-on day, the chimney gaily decorated at Christmas, Mill Row, the mill whistle sounding at noon and the constant layer of bagasse covering every surface in our home, much to my mother's distress.

Many changes are ahead of us, but we must not forget that tourists come from all over the world to enjoy all of other wonderful attractions Babinda has to offer.



Babinda Chamber of Commerce




