# "The Presidents Notes"

Hi everyone,

We are pleased to announce that a Steering Group has been established with the Babinda Community to discuss Redevelopment of the old Sugar Mill site and a local business Expansion and Retention Program. The Steering group includes: Representatives from Maryborough Sugar Factory (MSF - the Mill Site Owners), Babinda Chambers of Commerce, Babinda Taskforce and Cairns Regional Council.

Further to these Plans a M.O.U. (Memorandum Of Understanding) has been signed on the 5<sup>th</sup> May 2011 between Cairns Regional Council and the Maryborough Sugar Factory to a support a Partnership approach to the redevelopment. The M.O.U. was signed by Mayor Val Schier and Maryborough Sugar's Mike Barry at a morning tea at the Babinda Taskforce.

Procedure for putting ideas forward will be as follows:

Business ideas may be taken to a Chambers of Commerce meeting (1<sup>st</sup> Tues of each month, 5.30pm at Roddos) Community ideas may be taken to a Taskforce meeting (3<sup>rd</sup> Thur of each month, 9.30am at Taskforce)

Notification of attendance is necessary. If someone wants to attend regularly then membership would be preferable.

The Steering Committee will meet approx every 3 weeks. Rod Edwards and myself will be the direct contacts. Anyone wanting to keep updated with progress will need to give us their email address.

**Please Note:** Next Taskforce general meeting is scheduled for Thursday 19th May 9:30am at the Taskforce Office. Everyone welcome, see you there.

#### **POLICE NEWS**

Well finally the sun is shining and the weather is cooling down, a lovely change and time to dry out the house the dogs and the kids. I have had the past three weeks off on leave over Easter whilst Senior Constable Bob TRAINOR from South Johnstone relieved my position. It seems that the staff at the station didn't get much of a rest over the Easter break which was quite busy for us. I was dismayed to see another rescue at Josephine falls on the news whilst on leave this time involving the rescue helicopter. After requesting ideas from the public over recent months I have had some great suggestions for tacking this never ending problem at the falls. I am currently involved in a project, 'survive the dive' with QFRS swift water rescue and DERM looking at strategies to try to reduce the number of rescues and associated fatalities. I can say that we are making some headway at implementing some of the strategies which will for the most part be implemented in time for the next wet season.

I have conducted research into the falls as part of the project and 2010 was an absolute horror year for rescues and deaths at the falls, the likes of which has not been seen for many years. The last thing the local community needs is to have Josephine Falls closed so if you use the area please be aware of the surroundings and maybe give some helpful advice to tourists if you see some danger. Furthermore if anyone has any suggestions to reduce these incidents please give me a ring at the station and let me know.

#### Take the test - prevent kidney disease

Early intervention and prevention is the best way to combat Kidney Disease.

Kidney Health Week will be held from 22-29 May 2011 and is a great opportunity for you to find out if you are at risk of kidney disease.

Kidney disease is one of Queensland's major health challenges, with one in three of us at risk of developing chronic kidney disease.

There are some things that can increase your likelihood of developing chronic kidney disease such as diabetes, high blood pressure, obesity, family history and smoking.

I encourage all residents to have a test. If you are at risk, you can act early to prevent it.

The number of people in Queensland with chronic kidney disease needing dialysis or kidney transplantation is growing by about six per cent a year.

The annual cost of dialysis and organ transplantation for people with chronic kidney disease in Queensland is forecast to rise to more than \$200 million by 2017.

That's a certainty if people don't take responsibility for the state of their health with regular physical activity, controlling blood pressure, reducing overweight and obesity, or quitting smoking.

The good news is that chronic kidney disease can be prevented.

Without better prevention and personal management of chronic disease, it's estimated demand for renal dialysis and transplant services in Queensland will increase by 70 per cent over the next decade.

If you think you might be at risk, or you know someone who could be, see a doctor and have a blood pressure, blood and urine test to check kidney function. Early intervention is vital.



#### Bowel Cancer Awareness Week, June 5-11.

Bowel cancer is a major health problem contributing to the burden of disease in Australia, with 1 in 22 Australians likely to develop bowel cancer before the age of 85. This equates to 80 Australians dying every week from a disease that is up to 75% preventable through protective lifestyle factors! Screening for bowel cancer also has the potential to save lives. This involves testing for bowel cancer in people who do not have any obvious signs and symptoms of the disease. The aim is to find any polyps, or to find cancer early when it is easier to treat and cure.

There are some very quick and simple things your workplace can do to be involved in Bowel Cancer Awareness Week

- 1) Send a promotional email to staff
- 2) Add a message on pay slips
- 3) Install a screensaver on all computers
- 4) Host a bowel cancer display
- 5) Book an information session for your employees

#### NEWS FROM BABINDA S E S



Cyclones Tasha and Yasi continue to have an effect in our area, even though we were spared the destruction wreaked further south. Babinda SES Local Controller Shirley and Group Leader Phil have been attending a series of "Wash-Up" seminars at which engineering and climate experts have divulged preliminary findings relevant to the year's cyclones. JCU experts have analysed the damage which occurred to various types and ages of buildings, and a good piece of news is that homes built since 1980 – to new engineering standards – suffered much less than older houses.

There are also indications that taping areas of glass may not be effective, and the standard procedure of opening a window on the opposite side to the current prevailing gusts may contribute to roof losses. It is hoped that all results will be made public well before the next cyclone "season" just ended. I celebrated May Day by removing the heavy chains from my shed, which I installed before Tasha and which I believe held the Larry-damaged building together this year.

We are looking forward to our Community's celebration of the Harvest on June 4. Babinda SES will man the gate and install road barriers and carry out traffic control as usual at the Harvest Festival big day. Pause and say Hullo to us as you come through the gate – the entry fee remains at only \$ 2 as it has for many years – best entertainment value in Australia!! We also plan to have a presence in the Festival Procession along with our sister Emergency Service organisations, and I hear a whisper that Cairns SES may have a highly visible (and noisy) entry in the parade...

Till then, our training continues and our A Team is on standby 24/7.

#### SETTLERS' MUSEUM ITEM OF THE MONTH

#### From Don Lawie

Do you remember when, if you had a medical problem, you went to the Ambulance Station at any time, day or night and rang the bell? Today we ring Triple 0 and they are at our door in next to no time. The Settlers' Museum has a poignant reminder of days gone by. Mr Jack Johnston was Q.A.T.B. Superintendent in both Babinda and Gordonvale for some time just after the Great War. He was the first Gordonvale Superintendent and this is a photo of the Night Bell which hung outside the Ambulance Station door. Ring the bell - any time - and Mr Johnston was there for you. When Mr Johnston retired he passed the bell to Mr Tom Briggs, who used it for the following 21 years. By then, modern communications had appeared and there was a push-button night bell – remember the sign outside Babinda QATB? "Ring Bell for Service".

The bell is small – only about 20 cm long and the mouth is 10cm wide, the handle is wooden and the bell brass. One can hold this bell in the hand and imagine all the times it was used – worried parents, vehicle accidents, scalds, burns, cuts – all were answered promptly and compassionate and effective aid administered, or if a serious problem, the patient was taken to hospital. Queensland was far ahead of the rest of Australia with its Ambulance Service and our modern Paramedics continue this proud service.

When Mr Briggs retired he retained the bell and his widow donated it to the Settlers' Museum as a tangible reminder of Days Gone By.
