While every care is taken in the publication of advertisements and articles, Babinda News cannot be held responsible for omissions or errors or their subsequent effects. When I started at Council in May last year, we were rushed to bring down a very quick budget.

At the time we were \$6.6 mil in deficit. In forming the 2013/14 FY Budget, we have worked hard to make savings in the way we do business to ensure the public dollar is being spent wisely. We have lowered our spending on operations but aim to maintain frontline services to our community.

I believe that these initiatives will result in a more focussed Council that is more responsive to community expectations, is positioned to maintain and improve its delivery of core services and is able to capitalise on future opportunities as they arise.

The Mayor has stated the overall mood and the business activity in the region are much better than anyone would have predicted a year ago. The commencement of direct flights from China and the announcement that Cairns had been chosen to host the G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors meeting next year has generated a heightened interest in our city and the region – not only as somewhere to visit, but as an attractive alternative for international investors, many of whom are emerging from China.

I would like to see Babinda harness this optimism when looking for investment into the old Mill site. Any Regional growth will promote flow-on strength for the industrial and commercial precincts within Babinda.

Regionally, Council will continue to financially support major events which deliver significant benefits to the local economy. These events include the Cairns Ironman, the Mountain Bike Championships and the 2014 Great Barrier Reef Masters Games.

Our continued attention to promoting the region through these initiatives is critical to any sustained recovery in the local economy.

This Council recognises the financial pressures and the imposts on the cost of living now being experienced by the community. In response, we have limited rate increases to a minimum at 3.89%. This is less than raises to inflation and the CPI. Savings we have made have enabled us to balance our budget and for the first time in many years are no longer in deficit.

I think this is a strong position to be in and is positive for the growth of our region. Steve





Funding benefits Babinda Pony Club

The Babinda Pony Club is among 10 community organisations in Mulgrave to share in over \$142,000 of grant funding from the latest rounds of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund and Reef Hotel Casino Community Benefit Fund.

The Babinda Pony Club will receive \$35,000 from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to construct an amenities block that also includes toilet and shower facilities for people with a disability. Currently there are no facilities at all on the Club grounds.

Not only will these facilities benefit all club members and the wider



community, it will also allow the club to progress with their partnership with the Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA). The club has already established an ongoing method to finance the RDA project through income earned from their recently installed solar photovoltaic inverter system which will continue to generate income indefinitely.

In a double funding boost, the Babinda Pony Club will also receive \$15,000 to purchase a tractor with funds from the Reef Hotel Casino Community Benefit Fund.

This is a much needed financial boost with club members having previously contributed countless hours in fundraising events such as pony rides at the Babinda Harvest Festival and Innisfail Show along with other activities such as the Gordonvale Pyramid Race weekend, sausage sizzles and numerous other fundraising events.

Field trial commences in Babinda

July 2013

Thanks to strong community support, the Eliminate Dengue research project began a new field trial on the 4th July 2013.

The goal of the field trial in Babinda is to establish *Wolbachia* in the local *Aedes aegypti* population, which we believe will reduce the chance of local dengue transmission. The field trial involves the release of *Wolbachia* mosquitoes on a weekly basis at properties around Babinda. Like in our previous trial, we will keep the community informed with the progress of the field trial via monthly updates in the Babinda Taskforce newsletter.

Despite the onset of the dry season, dengue is still being transmitted in and around Cairns this year, so we encourage people to continue to protect themselves from dengue and being bitten by mosquitoes through out the duration of the field trial.



Babinda Multipurpose Health Service Accessing aged care services in Babinda

Babinda Multipurpose Health Service (MPHS) now provides residential aged care at the Hospital. The MPHS can also provide services to people in their own homes.

Currently, Babinda MPHS can provide residential care, either high or low care, for 11 residents.

Accessing services in Babinda is relatively easy. "It is important to speak to your doctor about aged care options in the first instance" explains Daniel Winters-McAppion, the MPHS Coordinator. "General Practitioners are the key point of contact to access long term care. Your doctor can refer you to an ACAT team for an assessment to determine eligibility and the type of aged care you need."

When eligible to live in an aged care facility, older people and their families will need to contact up to 5 facilities including Babinda MPHS to discover if a room is available or to get onto a waiting list.

"Whilst Babinda MPHS has a prerequisite to be a resident of the Babinda district, there is not always a room available, so alternative accommodation outside of Babinda may need to be accessed" Daniel advises. "If you have been assessed for aged care accommodation, then phone me to make an appointment so you can get onto the Babinda MPHS waiting list".

The Babinda community has a number of organisations that provide aged care in the home. Organisations such as St John, Blue Care, HACC, Meals on Wheels and OzCare continue to provide high quality care to older people or people with disabilities. The types of services available from these organisations range from personal assistance with hygiene, to assistance with mobility, meals and house cleaning. More complex care is also provided such as wound care, continence management, medicine management and pain control. Babinda MPHS is now able to compliment existing services in Babinda and district for care in the home.

"Babinda MPHS is not replacing existing service providers" says Daniel. "We will coordinate with the other providers, and will fill in any gaps that may exist for care in the home". Daniel points out that again, your doctor is the key to accessing services. "Your doctor can refer you to be assessed by the Babinda MPHS team, to determine if we can offer you care" Daniel explains. He stresses however, that anyone can phone the Babinda MPHS Social Worker, Ursula Thiessen, to discuss options.

Additional nurses and other specialist staff continue to be recruited by Babinda MPHS to provide care to MPHS aged care residents and people in their own homes.

Daniel can be contacted on 4067 8206 between 8.30 am and 4.30 pm weekdays except for Thursdays, and Ursula is available on the same number each Wednesday.
