

Hi everyone,

Thank you to the 10 members that attended the Taskforce AGM. Much appreciation to Tanya Tuttle for officiating the election of office bearers. Appreciation to the outgoing executives and congratulations to the incoming: welcome to Kasey Shaw on her acceptance as Vice President and thank you to Kylie Luce and Pete Carnsew for staying on for another year as Secretary and Treasurer respectively. Thanks also to Mel and Jody for voting me back in for another year. I look forward to working with you all in the year to come.

It has been suggested to me that I put a general rundown of what we do here, so here goes: Within the month of September we: dealt with approximately 50 Centrelink queries time spent with each query ranging from 1 minute to approx 2 hours, booked several QR train tickets: several performances through Ticket link. Provided internet access to travelers and locals, photocopied, faxed, printed and laminated documents all at a very fair/low price. Sold pens, local phone books and typed documents. Negotiated the renewal of a lease, had the privilege of having a Babinda State School year 12 student here for 1 weeks work experience. Facilitated several meetings/venues for some local and not so local groups and individuals. Received a reply from a grant we applied to for funding of the Mural Workshop (to continue painting the bins) for 2014 but unfortunately missed out this round. We're still looking at other avenues for funding for this as this we consider this a valuable project not only for the wider community, the travelers that comment positively on them, but mainly for our school aged children from 8 years and older as it gives them a sense of pride in their community. Welcome to another month and I hope you have been well. A few people have asked me where's Peter. He is currently on his annual leave and is working in Cairns until mid-December. We look forward to getting him back. You work flat out in Cairns and any other city. In towns like Babinda you get just as fatigued as you in the cities because you have call outs day and night near and far continuously for 8 days – you look forward to your days off after that. In places like Cairns you do your shift then get to go home not being on call.

In other staff matters Tarah who has worked here for the past nearly 5 months is leaving us. She has accepted a position in Tully Ambulance. She says she will miss Babinda but looks forward to the lure of Mission Beach and not doing so much on call. I would like to thank her for her efforts over the past months. I haven't had holidays this year so am looking forward to going camping next week with the family. There will be a relief officer from Cairns covering my 2 week absence. Once again I ask people to consider clearly marking their house number making it visible from the road. It saves emergency crews a lot of angst if we can locate you quickly. There is a high proportion of properties with no number marking or marking that you can't see from the road in an ambulance particularly when it is dark or wet.

The theme of the recent APSL conference was "Unite to Fight for Seniors Rights"

I would like to share with you some of the AGENDA item which were discussed and voted on at the conference to improve living conditions for Qld pensioners, and that the APSL Qld will be lobbying both State & Federal

Governments to achieve for pensioners.


- 1. To lobby Telstra and other Telco Corporations and the Federal Government to make telephone line rental free for all pensioners.
- **2.** That the APSL Qld lobbies the State Government to achieve free or discounted drivers licenses for pensioners in Qld
- **3.** That the APSL Qld lobbies the State Government to achieve free or greater concessions for car registration in line with other states.
- **4.** That the State Government provides better travel concessions for pensioners on QR Travel Trains **Reason:** Vouchers have doubled in price and have been limited on seat allocations on trains.
- **5.** That the APSL lobbies both State & Federal Government to achieve free mobile devices for all pensioners which alert emergency services automatically in case of health emergency.

These items are just a few of what the APSL Qld will be fighting for, to improve the lives and living conditions, for Qld pensioners over the next 12 months. Some of the items will or may be achieved in present form or may be need to be negotiated to achieve the best outcome for pensioners. Some may also be rejected, but if we don't at least try pensioners living conditions will not improve.

Cairns Regional Council has prepared a new draft planning scheme to comply with State government requirements. The draft planning scheme will affect all residents, as it sets the framework for future growth and development in the Cairns region.

Planning schemes guide and shape an area by setting out how land can be used and how buildings and structures are developed. This includes planning for infrastructure to support growth and create a more diversified economy, while continuing to promote the lifestyle and character of the region.

How to have your say

Council encourages all members of the public to take an interest in the draft planning scheme and have a say. The planning scheme is available on Council's website at www.cairns.qld.gov.au/new-planning-scheme for public viewing and comment.

Online – use the online submission form on Council's website.

Submissions will close at 5pm on Friday 1 November 2013. After the public consultation period, Council will consider all submissions and respond to the issues raised.

This will be the first of two opportunities to comment on the draft planning scheme, with further public consultation planned for mid-2014.

'Lock it or risk losing it'

A WATERY BABINDA BLAST FROM THE PAST The Cairns Post

Thursday 14th April 1921

Watery Babinda [NOTHING HAS CHANGED]

Mr.S. Favell writes from the State School, Babinda, as follows:- I am forwarding herewith, a copy of the Babinda rainfall, which I would like you to publish in your valuable paper:-1915, 90.43 ins: 1916, 202.81 inches: 1917, 161.68ins; 1918,151.97ins.;1919, 118.43ins.;1920, 182.88ins.; 1921, January 28.91ins. February 28.35ins, March 81.25ins, April (to 13th) 19.12ins. TOTAL 157.63ins. It is my opinion that Babinda has the biggest rainfall in Australia. We beat Innisfail at any rate. The figures were supplied by the Babinda Central Mill.

'For not doing what we oughta', They've condemned us of this crime


What an awful thing to happen! Oh what shame! Such dreadful shame!

Field Trial Update

October 2013

Results of our field trial remain encouraging after two months of mosquito releases. On 29th August, 77% of *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes we collected in Babinda carried *Wolbachia*.

While this is slightly down from last month's result (79%), some fluctuation is typical and we expect to see this figure rise again. We will continue to monitor how many mosquitoes carry *Wolbachia* and update you on the results.

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce Sarah Flenley, who is now leading our community engagement efforts. Sarah has taken over from Flora, who we said goodbye to last month.
