Field Trial Update

September 2013

Initial field trial results from 25th July showed 79% of mosquitoes we collected in Babinda carried *Wolbachia* after four weeks of releases. This is a promising start to the first dry-season release of *Aedes aegypti* mosquitoes that carry *Wolbachia*, but it will be some months until we know the overall outcome of the field trial.

The aim of the field trial is to establish *Wolbachia* in the local mosquito population, which we believe will reduce the risk of local dengue transmission.

No Interest Loan Scheme can give a helping hand

I would like to bring to the attention of anyone finding it hard to make ends meet the No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) which can help with the cost of buying household items.

NILS is a community-based loan program that provides interest free loans for those living on low incomes.

Buying essential household items can be a stretch for low income earners but help is available for the necessary everyday items which everyone deserves to have in their home such as a fridge, washing machine, TV, bed or clothes dryer.

There are no fees, charges or interest on the money borrowed through NILS and the scheme is a viable alternative to high-cost personal loans or credit cards.

Loans are available between \$200 and \$1200 and the repayment period is usually around 12 to 18 months.

NILS is a financial life support and I urge families, single parents, seniors or individuals going through tough times to look into accessing the loan to make life a little easier.

To be eligible for NILS you must have a Health Care Card or Pension Card and earn less than \$30,000 per year.

The national scheme, started in 1981, is coordinated by the community organisation Good Shepherd Youth and Family Service and delivered by local community groups.

The Scheme is operated on a 'circular community credit' basis - when a borrower makes a repayment the funds are then available to loan to someone else in the community.

In the last financial year 19,974 loans to the value of \$18.1 million were issued through NILS. 70% of all borrowers were women and 27% of all borrowers identified themselves as Indigenous Australians.

The Queensland NILS program is supported by the Queensland Government, Federal Government and

National Australia Bank.


PYRAMID 1 – A Grade Winners!! 😊


