Our Society has for a number of years set up various displays in this window by kind courtesy of Curtis, and before him Warren Pitt, to publicise our Society and our Museum in Gordon Street. We commenced this calendar year with a new display representing Schools of Yesteryear. Pauline and her helpers installed an old, genuine two pupil school desk and Pauline made up a "pupil" wearing our son's St Rita's Babinda uniform of many years ago. She then put in some additions : an old "ging" made from car tube and guava branch fork in his hip pocket, some marbles in his shirt pocket, and although our boy appears to be diligently studying his School Atlas he has a lurid comic inserted in it, visible to viewers from the footpath but not to a tall "Sir" who stands in front of the blackboard with a dreaded cane ready to administer justice. A number of other education artefacts complement the display which will be in place for the next few months.

It was good fun devising and setting up this display. History is not all dry facts and dates and our members gain enjoyment as well as education and inspiration in presenting the history of our old Mulgrave Shire to residents and visitors. 

The Mule-Morning Post Cairns Sat. 2 September 1899

evening Mr Lewis had an idle hour on his hands which he devoted to training his mule. So much success attended his efforts that he decided to continue the education of the animal, with the result that after a week's tuition the mule now performs some astonishing feats when Mr Lewis gives the word of command in Welsh. The really wonderful tricks performed by the animal could hardly be believed by any not seeing them, but the most surprising circumstance about the whole affair is that the mule should have learned the Welsh language in the short space of a week. #### Buttermilk-Blueberry Breakfast Cake

½ cup unsalted butter, room temperature
Zest from 1 large lemon
3/4 cup sugar
1 egg, room temperature
1 tsp. vanilla essence
2 cups flour
2 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
2 punnets fresh blueberries
½ cup buttermilk

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C. Cream butter with lemon zest and sugar until light and fluffy.

2. Add the egg and vanilla and beat until combined. Meanwhile, toss the blueberries with 1/4 cup of flour, then whisk together the remaining flour, baking powder and salt.

3. Add the flour mixture to the batter a little at a time, alternating with the buttermilk. Fold in the blueberries.

4. Grease a suitable baking pan with butter or coat with non-stick spray. Spread batter into pan. Sprinkle batter with a tablespoon of sugar. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes. Check with a toothpick. Let cool at least 15 minutes before serving.

5. Enjoy.


#### St Rita's School

The Babinda Task Force acknowledges the positive and rewarding value of the Meals on Wheels Service, to the good health of our elderly, disabled or temporarily unwell.

All staff and volunteers involved in the Service, do so with good intentions and do not draw a salary.

Meals on Wheels began in Britain during the 2nd World War and was established in Australia in 1952.

Meals on Wheels is not means tested and is geared to the needs of the frail older person.

Babinda can be very proud of this service. Take advantage of it.

Bicycles are considered vehicles under Queensland law, therefore the rules regarding drink driving whilst driving a car are almost the same as they are whilst people are riding a bike. It is permissible for an officer to arrest a subject person for an offence against s. 79(1) of the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act* based solely on the observations (see <u>Appendix 7.3</u>) by that officer of the subject person (indicia alone). However, in any such cases the officer must have formed an opinion that the subject person was under the influence of liquor or a drug and the subject person should then be required to provide a specimen of breath for analysis or a specimen of blood for a laboratory test. When persons are suspected of committing an offence under s. 79(7) of the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act* (such as a person riding a bicycle or a horse whilst under the influence of liquor or a drug), authority exists to require that such persons provide a specimen of breath for analysis or a specimen of blood for a laboratory test following the arrest of such persons.

#### Please remember:

#### Do not walk or play in floodwaters

Fast flowing water hides all sorts of dangers including slippery surfaces, uneven ground, strong currents, fences, vehicles, rocks, long grass, tree branches, sewage, chemicals, sharp objects and electrical current.

In some circumstances the force of fast flowing water can be multiplied many times. Things like metal drains and grilles beneath the water can generate very strong currents and quickly trap a person.

Even near the water's edge the slope of the ground, slippery surface or currents can cause a person to lose their footing. Everyone should stay three meters back from the waterline.

#### <u>Keep a close eye on children.</u>

Water at ankle height can cause you to lose your footing and once you have slipped, it can be very hard to get back out.

#### Storm drains

In urban areas large volumes of fast flowing water can come and go in minutes, easily sucking or trapping anyone who gets too close to drains, pipes or grills.

Entrances to drains, pipes and grills are not a place to play. They are slippery, have strong pulling power and are very hard to get out of.

#### Dams and weirs

Flooded dams and weirs are dangerous places to play – especially around outlets or spillways where turbulence can sweep a person off their feet and pin them under churning water.

#### A BLAST FROM THE PAST

MIRRIWINNI NOTES article from The Cairns Post Friday 26 November 1954 PERSONAL

Visitors to Maureen Kruckow's (now Raddatz) 21st birthday party were from Babinda: Misses A. O'Brien. J. Greenwood, S. Martin, R. Sermon, T. Sermon, M. Patrick (now Maisie Smith), S. Sewell, Mrs J. Gaylor, Mrs Bell, M. Lock (now Morine Kruckow), Mrs C. Newman, Messrs. S. Dillon, B. O'Brien, C. Kenney, G. Quinlan from Innisfail, Miss Ailsa Shang (now Ailsa Tinning) COMING OF AGE.

A party given by Mr. and Mrs. F. Kruckow in honour of their eldest daughter Maureen, was held in the Mirriwinni Hall at 8 pm on November 20. Guests came from Cairns, Babinda and Innisfail. Maureen received her guests wearing a white nylon frock with strapless, beaded bodice, forming a peak on each side, and added a coloured spray in pink and blue. The voluminous skirt was ballerina length. To complete her toilette she added white sandals, diamente chandelier earrings and diamente bracelet. She was assisted by her mother, Mrs. F. Kruckow, who wore a grey silk organza over pink satin, the bodice of which was fitting with a wide roll collar of broderie anglaise on to a full skirt. Diamente brooch, pearls and pearl earrings finished the effect of the ensemble.

Dancing to the strains of the Black and White Orchestra from Cairns was enjoyed. At 10 pm the 90 guests sat down to a sumptuous repast prepared by Mrs. G. Gaylor, of Babinda. The tables with their white cloths and blue trimmings were decked with vases of zinnias, asters, dahlias, gerberas, orchids and fern.

Pride of place on the well laden tables was the two-tiered birthday cake made by her mother and beautifully iced in white with blue trellis design and roses, with two iced keys tied with blue ribbon bows, silver cashews and was topped by a good luck ladder and horseshoe by Mrs. Gaylor.

Mr. J. Magriplis was chairman and the first toast was the loyal toast. This was followed by a toast in champagne to the guest of honour and was supported by R. Musumeci on behalf of the Mirriwinni Junior Farmers, other speeches were made by Miss Ann O'Brien (captain of the Babinda Basketball team), Mrs H. Griffiths (ladies).

Maureen suitably responded.

Mr. B. Brand proposed the toast to the parents, which was responded to by Mr. F. Kruckow. As the cake was cut the guests all sang "For She's a Jolly Good Fellow," "Happy Birthday" and "I'm Twenty-one To-day." She was then presented with a polished key suitably inscribed for the occasion by her father and was later autographed by all.

A special presentation was made by Mr. B. Parkinson on behalf of Messrs. H. Griffiths, R. Collins and himself. Mr J. Mellick (Babinda) delighted with two violin solos, "Jealousy" and "Stardust."
